PHILANTHROPIC ACTIVITIES:



Environment: On the occasion of World Environment Day, the staff, Bal Vikas students, school children and environmentally conscious citizens came together in New Shimla to participate in a plantation drive, reaffirming their shared commitment to environmental conservation and sustainable development.

Further enriching the celebrations, the students and teachers at Dr. Vijay Memorial Senior Secondary School, Dharampur (Mandi), actively participated in a series of awareness initiatives.



These included administering an environmental protection pledge, conducting a slogan march through the local community to promote environmental awareness, organising a science quiz and undertaking a cleanliness drive in the surrounding areas.

The occasion reflected the enthusiasm and collective commitment of all participants towards

protecting the natural environment. Every sapling planted and every awareness initiative undertaken represented a meaningful contribution towards building a greener, healthier and more sustainable future.



As part of its ongoing commitment to sustainable agriculture and rural development, the Foundation successfully organised a Turmeric and Ginger Seed Distribution Programme to encourage farmers to adopt Natural Farming practices while cultivating high-value spice crops.



On 15th May, 2026, the Foundation distributed 300 kg of Turmeric seed (Variety: Rajendra Sonia) and 80 kg of Ginger seed (Variety: Assamese) among farmers.

Continuing this initiative, on 15th June, 2026, Foundation distributed 800 kg of Rajendra Sonia Turmeric seed to farmers from different villages in District Mandi (H.P.).



During the programme, farmers were encouraged to adopt Natural Farming practices to enhance soil

fertility, reduce cultivation costs and produce safe, residue-free agricultural produce.



Through these initiatives, Foundation continues to empower farming communities by providing quality planting material, promoting sustainable agricultural practices and supporting farmers in enhancing both productivity and income while conserving the environment for future generations.

Devotion and Health: As part of the ongoing Centenary Celebrations of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, the nationwide Rath Yatra (Sri Sathya Sai Prema Pravahini) reached the Dharampur region on 11th May, 2026 where it received a warm and devotional welcome from devotees and local residents through traditional customs and heartfelt participation.



In the evening, a spiritually uplifting Bhajan Sandhya was organised, bringing together devotees, volunteers and staff in an atmosphere of unity, devotion and reverence.





The students at Dr. Vijay Memorial Senior Secondary School presented a cultural programme along with a meaningful theatrical performance depicting the life and teachings of Bhagwan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. Following the devotional programme, dinner (*Prasadam*) was affectionately served to all devotees.



The Foundation successfully organised a Free Medical Camp on 12th May, 2026 at Dharampur, District Mandi. The camp received an overwhelming response, benefiting more than 500 people.



A team of specialist doctors provided healthcare services across a range of disciplines, including General Medicine, Cardiology, Ophthalmology, Dental Care and General Health Check-ups.



Free medicines were distributed to patients and the Foundation also provided free spectacles for individuals suffering from vision related ailments. In addition, a community lunch (*Bhandara*) was organised for the beneficiaries of the medical camp.



The Foundation, in collaboration with the World Cancer Care Charitable Society and other NGOs organised free medical camps at Birthin (Kharota), Tehsil Jhandutta on 19th June, 2026 and Gangloh, Tehsil Jhandutta on 20th June, 2026. The camps were conducted to promote preventive healthcare and raise awareness about the importance of early detection of life-threatening diseases.



The camps provided screening for breast, cervical and oral cancers, along with blood tests and examinations for blood pressure and blood sugar levels. The Foundation ensured that all beneficiaries

received free medical consultation and medicines. Complimentary lunch was also served to the general public attending the camps, ensuring their comfort and well-being throughout the programme.



On the occasion of International Yoga Day, a medical camp with special focus on Cardiology was organised in association and collaboration with the Harihar Hospital at Dr. Vijay Memorial Senior Secondary School, Dharampur, District Mandi (H.P.).



The School also commemorated International Yoga Day on 21st June, 2026 with an early morning session organized for students and staff highlighting the importance of yoga in fostering physical fitness, mental well-being and healthy lifestyle.

Education and Student Welfare: The Entrance Examination for admission to Class IX at Dr. Vijay Memorial Senior Secondary School (DVMSSS), Dharampur, was conducted on 5th April, 2026 in the

general areas and on 3rd May, 2026 in the tribal areas of the State.



Students who qualified have been enrolled and are being provided with free education, uniforms, hostel accommodation and all other necessary facilities up to Class XII.

In addition, Foundation has been providing free coaching, accommodation and financial assistance to 12 meritorious students from economically weaker backgrounds of Dr. Vijay Memorial Senior Secondary School, Dharampur, District Mandi (H.P.), enabling them to prepare for prestigious national-level competitive examinations.

The beneficiaries included 3 students preparing for the National Defence Academy (NDA), who successfully completed an 11-day preparatory course at Gurukul Kurukshetra (Haryana), 5 students preparing for the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) and 4 students preparing for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) at Aspire Academy, Shimla.



The Foundation successfully organised an Inter-School Declamation Competition on 26th April,

2026 at Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Himrashmi Parisar, Vikas Nagar, Shimla. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across both competition categories and provided a vibrant platform for young minds to articulate their ideas, enhance their public speaking abilities and showcase their intellectual confidence.

The competition was conducted on the following contemporary themes:

- Environment and Our Responsibility.
- Indigenous Products: Their Role in the Atmanirbhar Bharat (Self-Reliant India) Mission.
- Awareness Among Youth Towards Drug Abuse Prevention.

In the Class IX–X Category, Ms. Aaniya Sharma of Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Himrashmi Parisar secured the First Prize while Mr. Yajas Thakur of Shimla Public School was awarded the Second Prize. The Third Prize was won by Ms. Mahika Sharma of DAV Public School, New Shimla.

In the Class XI-XII Category, Ms. Adaa Panta of Convent of Jesus and Mary School secured the First Prize while Ms. Ananya Thakur of Loreto Convent School, Tara Hall was awarded the Second Prize. Third Prize was won by Ms. Arpita of Dr. Vijay Memorial Sen. Sec. School, Dharampur, District Mandi (H.P.)



Cash prizes were awarded to the winners in recognition of their outstanding performances and exemplary communication skills. Such initiatives reflect the Foundation's continued commitment to nurturing well-rounded, articulate and socially responsible future citizens through holistic educational development.

Moreover, Foundation also extended financial assistance to various deserving students to help

meet their educational expenses and continued awarding scholarships under the Sai Scholarship Scheme to meritorious students pursuing education at school and college levels.

Social Welfare:



Demonstrating its continued commitment to public welfare and community service, the Foundation recently donated equipment like Aquaguard to Civil Hospital, Sandhole, Tehsil Dharampur, District Mandi (H.P.).



The Foundation provided dustbins in Sidhpur, Tehsil Dharampur, District Mandi to support the maintenance of cleanliness and hygiene within the locality. The initiative is expected to promote better waste management, enhance cleanliness and reinforce community participation in maintaining a clean and healthy environment.

Additionally, the activity of extending financial assistance to underprivileged individuals for medical treatment and to victims of natural disasters continued to be undertaken. The Foundation will

continue to reach out as far and wide as possible to provide succour and promote well rounded socio-economic development.

DHARTIDHAR: PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT

Meeting with Dhartidhar Farmers at KVK Dhaula Kuan, Sirmaur



A meeting with farmers from the Dhartidhar region was organised at Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Dhaula Kuan on 23rd April, 2026. The session was attended by our Directors, Sh. R.K. Verma and Sh. B.S. Chauhan along with Sh. Bharat Bhushan (Trustee of BDSN Seva Nyas), Sh. Praveen Arya (All India Trustee of Ekal Foundation), KVK scientists and the DDA, Agriculture Department. Discussions focused on promoting Natural Farming, food processing and value addition to agricultural produce with the objective of enhancing farmers' income and advancing sustainable agriculture.

Distribution of Saplings



In April 2026, the Foundation coordinated with KVK Dhaula Kuan to procure 1,100 chilli and brinjal saplings, which were distributed among

approximately 40 farmers for Natural Farming trials.

Seed Distribution and Farmer Awareness



To encourage sustainable cultivation practices, the Foundation distributed 300 kg of turmeric seed to approximately 150 farmers. In collaboration with the ATMA Department, an additional 200 kg of turmeric seed, 120 kg of Black Gram seed and 60 kg of Kodo millet seed were distributed to more than 120 farmers. Awareness programmes on Natural Farming were conducted, while Front Line Demonstration (FLD) turmeric seeds were provided to approximately 35 farmers to promote improved cultivation techniques, seed multiplication and technical adoption.

RAWE Students' Visit to Dhartidhar

Students participating in the Rural Agricultural Work Experience (RAWE) programme from KVK Dhaula Kuan undertook a field visit to the panchayats of Dhartidhar.



Guided by KVK scientists, they interacted with farmers, studied local cropping patterns, identified

field-level challenges and discussed practical solutions for improving agricultural productivity, thereby strengthening the link between scientific knowledge and on-ground farming practices.

To identify profitable and region-specific crop opportunities, the Foundation initiated a ground-level survey in the Dharti Dhar region and engaged RAWE students from KVK Dhaula Kuan to conduct the assessment. The survey focused on evaluating the area's agricultural potential and recommending suitable high-value crops that can be integrated into the Foundation's upcoming Processing Unit Project which aims to promote value addition and create sustainable income opportunities for local farmers.

IIT Delhi Students' Field Visit



A team of students from IIT Delhi visited the panchayats of Dharti Dhar from 26th to 30th June, 2026. During the visit, they held interactive meetings with farmers and conducted a random survey covering water availability, crop patterns and productivity, farmers' income levels, livestock status and other agriculture and rural livelihood-related aspects. The study aimed to assess existing resources and socio-economic conditions to support informed planning and future interventions.

The Foundation initiated a field survey in association with IIT Delhi to understand the technological needs of farmers and identify solutions for reducing post-harvest losses. The collected field data will support the development of technology-driven agricultural interventions that improve productivity, strengthen farmer groups and enhance farmers' income through efficient post-harvest management.

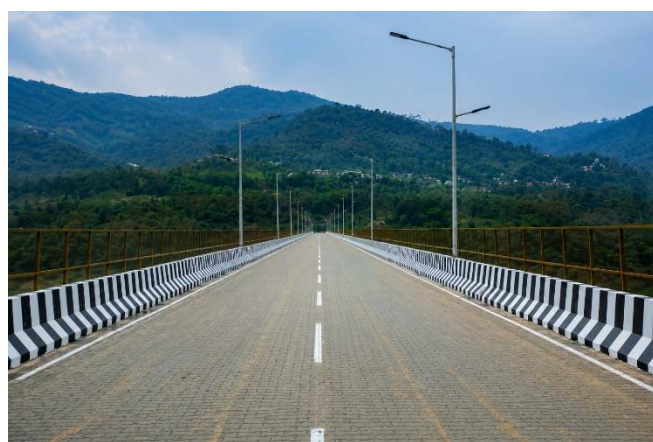
Nursery Visits and Seed Procurement

Visits were undertaken to nurseries in Saharanpur, Dehradun and Dhaula Kuan to assess the availability, quality and varieties of planting material and to obtain quotations. Seeds for nursery raising and community distribution, including Harad, Baheda, Amla and Moringa species were procured from Dehradun to promote the plantation of medicinal and fruit-bearing trees using quality planting material.

PROJECTS UNDER IMPLEMENTATION:

The project-wise status for the quarter is as follows:

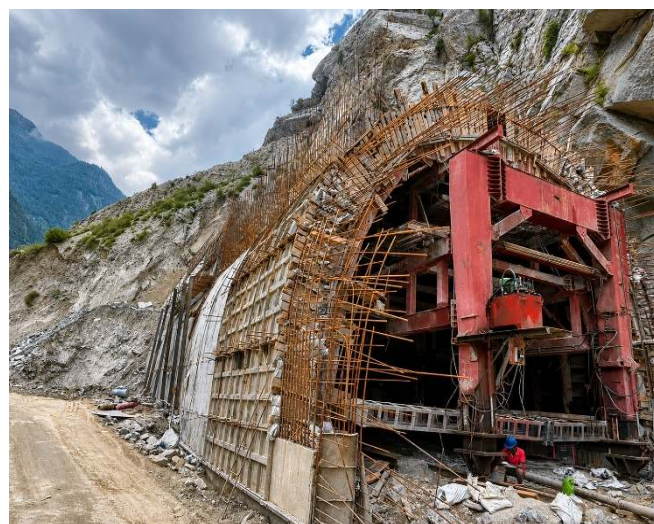
1. Nand-Nagroun Bridge, Bilaspur District.



Project completed in all respect and handed over to the Department.

2. Urni Tunnel, Kinnaur District.

On the downstream side, work remains at a standstill. Road remained closed due to continuous movement of Shongtong HEP OW/OD vehicles and the recent collapse of the existing steel Bailey bridge. Erection of 48 lattice girders and the associated primary support work from the downstream side have been completed.



In the upstream section, 41 metres of overt lining for the artificial tunnel has been completed. Excavation of the underground tunnel has progressed to 78 metres from the downstream portal out of a total 107 metres.

3. Shimla Bulk Water Supply Scheme (BWSS), Shimla District.



Water Treatment Plant, Shikrodi

Following the successful commissioning of the project and the demonstration of uninterrupted, reliable performance to the complete satisfaction of SJPNL, the Operation & Maintenance (O&M) period commenced.

Since the start of the O&M period, the water supply system has operated continuously and reliably without any major interruption. The project has consistently achieved the contractual minimum guaranteed water supply of 15 MLD, while maintaining an average daily supply of approximately 17 MLD in line with SJPNL's demand. The plant also successfully met peak demand, recording its highest daily supply of 34.51 MLD.

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) has consistently supplied treated water conforming to all prescribed contractual water quality parameters through efficient plant operation and continuous monitoring. The pumping system has also performed reliably, with pumps and motors operating efficiently. Typically, three pumping units operated for approximately eight hours per day to meet the

required demand, ensuring uninterrupted water transmission and dependable system performance.

The WTP and pumping system continue to be monitored and controlled through the SCADA system, enabling real-time supervision, operational control and performance monitoring. Remaining balance works related to SCADA integration are linked to the proposed Sanjauli Booster Chlorination Building and will be completed upon completion of the building works.

Overall, the project has demonstrated stable, efficient and reliable performance, consistently meeting contractual and operational requirements while ensuring the continuous supply of safe, treated drinking water to consumers.

4. Slope Stabilization, Ridge, Shimla District.



Major works were completed earlier with certain additional/ancillary works pending. Now, the final finishing work for the project is in progress.

5. Bhang Hydro Power Project, Kullu District.



The project is ready for commissioning and all commissioning tests are currently underway. The program includes hydrostatic filling and leak testing of the penstock, flushing and cleaning of water passages, calibration and functional checks of instrumentation and control systems, protection relay and electrical tests and no-load followed by

controlled load run trials of the turbine-generator unit. Each component will be inspected and certified after water filling to verify structural integrity, watertightness and operational performance. Provided no major issues arise during the trials, the team expects to complete the remaining tests and achieve full commissioning in August, 2026.

6. Tauhak Hydro Power Project, Kullu District.

The project is 95% complete, including civil and electro-mechanical works. The most challenging portion, the 35 m aqueduct, has been finished. Final finishing works, flushing of the penstock and turbine spinning are currently in progress. The project is scheduled for commissioning in August, 2026.



Training and Skill Development Report

Visit to Bharat Buildcon Expo 2026



Shri Pankaj Dhiman (Assistant General Manager - Purchase) and Shri Devender Pratap Singh (Assistant Purchase Officer) attended Bharat Buildcon Expo 2026 at Yashobhoomi, Dwarka, New Delhi on 18th June, 2026.

The visit provided valuable exposure to the latest advancements in construction materials, building technologies and digital procurement solutions.

During the expo, the officers interacted with leading manufacturers and industry partners, including Adani Cement, UltraTech Cement, Jindal Steel, Tata Steel, ASTRAL ERP Software, Jaquar and several other exhibitors to discuss product innovations, quality standards, supply capabilities and emerging procurement opportunities.

Participation in 4th Annual Conference on Pumped Hydro Storage.

Our Directors, Shri B. S. Chauhan and Shri Raj Kumar Verma along with Shri Sanjay Singhal (Advisor - Pump Storage Projects and Hydro), represented the Foundation at the 4th Annual Conference on Pumped Hydro Storage held on 23rd June, 2026 at Le Méridien, New Delhi.



The conference provided valuable insights into the growing role of Pumped Storage Projects (PSPs) in supporting renewable energy integration, grid stability and India's clean energy transition. Key discussions covered the evolving policy and regulatory framework, environmental and statutory clearances, financing and project economics, technological advancements, engineering best practices and strategies for efficient implementation and long-term operation of PSPs.

Empowering Rural Youth

The Foundation recently sponsored three aspiring youths for a 34-day residential training programme on Scientific Bee Keeping at CSIR-IHBT, Palampur. The training provided comprehensive practical knowledge in modern apiary management, including bee biology, seasonal hive management, queen bee rearing, colony multiplication organic disease management, hygienic honey extraction and the harvesting of value-added products such as beeswax and pollen.



Equipped with scientific knowledge and practical skills, the trainees are now prepared to establish eco-friendly honey production units, promoting sustainable livelihoods and inspiring entrepreneurship within their local farming communities.

SOCIAL INTERNSHIP TO STUDENTS

The Foundation is providing social internship opportunities to students from various institutions like including University of Petroleum and Energy Studies (Dehradun, Uttarakhand), Shoolini University (Solan) and Symbiosis International (Pune, Maharashtra). Through active participation in the Foundation's charitable and community development initiatives, students gain practical exposure to grassroots development, community engagement and the role of voluntary organisations in nation-building. The programme fosters social responsibility, compassion and leadership while enabling students to make meaningful contributions to society.

From the Founder's Desk



My Dear Fellow
Karmayogis,

Today, when we see our offices, our yards, our machinery, our vehicles and our tools and plants, it looks like a well-established organization. But I remember, in 1989 when this organization was started, we had no money, no means, no material and no machinery. We started from scratch, meaning that our net worth was literally zero.

We had a big dream that we will make a self-sustainable organization by earning through hard work in the field of design and construction and then using those earnings for social welfare. It was a dream that only a few believed in.

The financial institutions also did not believe in it. We went from bank to bank, financial institution to financial institution. They asked for net worth, collateral security and guarantees. We had nothing to offer except our honesty and our willingness to work. The loan cases were rejected. We were told that an NGO cannot do business and that business cannot be charity.

Those were days of poverty, struggle and sacrifice. Our early colleagues will remember that we were not having even shuttering and scaffolding. We used wooden shuttering, rented machinery and delayed salaries so that construction material could be purchased. Yet, the work continued. We continued our efforts through those bad days.

As you know, God helps those who help themselves. God sent an angel in human form “Shri Lalit Mahajan Ji”. He came forward when no institution was willing to grant a loan to an NGO with nil net worth, no collateral and no guarantee. He trusted not our balance sheet but our character, honesty, dedication, devotion and strong urge to serve society. With the finance provided by him, we were able to construct the Marhi and Toss Hydroelectric Projects. Those two projects became the turning point. They gave us credibility and through the hard work, sacrifice and devotion of many known and unknown hands, the present Foundation was built.

There were many ups and downs from 1989 to till date, but we survived because of Baba's grace. Now, we have a good net worth. We are self-sustaining and we are undertaking social welfare activities in the fields of Education, Healthcare, Environmental protection, Natural disaster relief and Relief to the poor—Exactly as we had dreamt.

For all these years, our thoughts always remained with our employees. We wanted to do much more welfare for Staff who served this organization with commitment and dedication. But our circumstances became adverse and our entire surplus was not only invested in creating infrastructure that was necessary to make us sustainable but also exhausted resources in meeting expenditure for SAILMA steel

penstock restoration in Kut and Baragaon HEP, free of cost. Further, derailment of Hydro power sector leading to retrenchment of staff further exhausted our resources. We have come out and the period of adversity is over. Now, we are able to give back. Therefore, the Board of Directors has taken two historic decisions to honour past and secure respectable future.

Decision 1: Samman Nidhi Samaroh at Dharampur, District Mandi (H.P.)

To honour the sacrifice of our former and serving employees, the Board has decided to organize a one-week *Samman Nidhi Samaroh* at Dharampur, District Mandi (H.P.) in the first week of November 2026, before Deepawali. During this sacred week, we will confer, *Samman Nidhi* and Ex-gratia amount as a mark of gratitude to honour those employees who served the organization during difficult times and in difficult areas.

Apart from this, incentives, prizes and the *Dirgha Seva Samman* will also be presented to our serving employees. This is not merely a function, it is a get together. All serving and former members, along with their families are cordially and lovingly invited.

Decision 2: From Samman Nidhi to Long-term Suraksha

The Board thought that giving *Samman Nidhi* once is good, but providing a lifelong source of income is true *Karmayoga*. With this thought and to provide long-term benefits to both former and current employees, the Board of Directors has decided to undertake the implementation of Janglikh and Tundah Hydroelectric Projects, through people's participation.

The model is simple and transparent. The Foundation will hold 51% equity and management control in these projects to safeguard everyone's interests and will invite our former and serving employees and people to participate in the remaining equity. Those who receive *Samman Nidhi*, as well as any staff member who wishes to secure the future of his or her family, may voluntarily choose to invest their *Samman Nidhi* or personal savings in these two projects.

This investment will make them a Co-owner in the power projects being built by the organization. These projects will generate power and revenue for

the next 35 to 40 years. Therefore, this small investment today will become source of regular return for the next four decades. This is our attempt to convert a one-time honour into 40-year return. Full details of participation - project cost, equity structure, minimum investment, expected return and tariff will be explained transparently during Dharampur function. Participation will be entirely voluntary and as per law.

I eagerly await to meet you all at Dharampur, to thank you, to honour you and invite you to become partners in the implementation of the projects.
